ARCHIVE

We have curated and displayed several exhibitions across Southern California.






BOOKS




We co-produced the short film *Schwarz Weiss* (2015) and have an educational YouTube series.

Where We Want to Go

- With a temporary space of ~1,000 sq. ft., we could:
 - Display 2-3 rotating exhibitions per year
 - Expand our internship program to include archival skills, exhibit design, and more
 - Offer more frequent lectures, panel discussions, interactive learning games, and other community events

Where We Want to Go

- With a space of 10-20,000 sq. ft., we could:
 - Display a permanent exhibition and 2-3 rotating exhibitions per year
 - Maintain a research library and archive
 - Host lectures, classes, conferences, screenings, concerts, and other community events
 - Build a memorial for victims of democide

Why Orange County?

OC has relatively few history museums compared to LA and San Diego counties.

OC has a large international community, but no broadly international-focused museum.

OC is densely populated and diverse, allowing us to reach a wide audience.
